Daylily Seeds: Production, harvesting, planting, growing. (Or: How to make your own amazing daylilies)

- 1: Chose some excellent daylilies to use as parents
- 2: Pollinate the Mother with pollen from the father
- 3: Record which daylily is the father
- 4: Wait until the pod ripens
- 5: Gather the seeds
- 6: Cool them for 3 to 4 weeks in a fridge
- 7: Plant them in deep pots
- 8: Water weekly, give them lots of light
- 9: Plant them in the garden in late May
- 10: Enjoy the flowers the following summer!

Selection of Parents:

Good parents are essential. Choose ones that can produce exceptional kids. Aim for something you consider worthy of the time and effort you are going to spend growing them. Choose some goals, select parents able to provide those features.

For instance, cross a ruffled, ideally colored but too short and small daylily with a tall one with lots of buds - ideally with similar color and patterns. Hopefully get tall, many buds kids with lots of ruffles and good color.

Selection of Parents:



Lovely color and edge, shorter than I like (18") and low bud count (10)

40" Tall, 44 bud count But flower not as attractive

Hopeful Kid: 36 - 40" tall, 40+ buds, ruffled edge

Selection of Parents:







Interesting color and edge, shorter than I like (12") and very low bud count (6)

33" Tall, 50 bud count But flower has no edging, ruffles or pattern

Hopeful Kid: 30 - 40" tall, 40+ buds, ruffled edge

and put it on the pistol of another.





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

Labels on the base of the flower allow you to keep track of the parents.

I use paper jewerly labels and some aluminum tags.

The paper ones are simpler and cheaper, but the details sometimes wash off.





The Aluminum tags are too long, so I cut them in half.

At \$28 for 100 they are \$0.30 each.

The paper tags are \$0.05 each.





If you use paper tags, it is advisable to use wrterproof ink.

I use Rite in the Rain pens.

A bit expensive, but they work.

On Amazon at \$28 per black pen or \$25 per orange 2 pack.



Not all seed pods look perfect. This one is partly rotten, but still has a good seed worth keeping.







When this seed pod was squeezed lightly, it popped open. Its ready to harvest - and has good seeds ready to gather. Harvesting BEFORE they pop open themselves prevents any bugs laying eggs in the pods.


I use plastic bags to store the seeds.

The plastic bag keeps them moist and can be written on to identify the parents.

Some seeds will rot or get moldy while in storage, especially if there is TOO MUCH moisture in the bag.

Most do well in plastic bags, and if not dried out, they are easier to germinate.





Then store the seeds in a refrigerator for three or more weeks.

I have stored them in this way for over a year and had close to the same level of germination.


If you plant them immediately after harvesting, about 50% will germinate.

If you cool them for 3 weeks or more about 75% will germinate.

Do not freeze them - many will die.



Take the bags out of the fridge, and sort them into groups that have similarities.




Sometimes the seeds have been in the fridge too long and some will have sprouted in the bags.

This is OK. They just start growing sooner.







I have tried many potting soils. Most work, but generally I used to mix my own: about 1/2 Peat Moss to 1/2 compost.

Two years ago I found a premixed soil that worked well and its much easier to just fill the pot without any premixing.

\$10/bag at Sheridan Nurseries. \$8 if you buy 3 or more.

1 bag = \sim 15 pots








Ideally plant the seeds 2 to 3 times their diameter below the surface. Daylily seeds will germinate lying on the surface, but they will move when watered and you lose track of which is which.

I use a Sharpie to indent the soil and label the pots.






I plant 12 - 25 seeds in one pot. I aim at 16 per pot, but some seeds are tiny and more will fit. Some seeds are huge so less fit.

The seed size usually relates to the plant size.

Small seeds = small plants.







Label the pots so that you know what is in each row. The labels wash off easily with 85% ethanol hand satirizer.



I have two seedling stands. Each one holds 6 trays of 12 pots.

Total = 144 pots

With 16 - 20 seeds = approx. 2500 seeds.

Light bulbs should be high lumens

Color is not critical for seedlings. I use daylight florescent or LEDs.






Water weekly - from the bottom not from the top. When watered from the top, it is ideal for cut worms / midge flies to grow and they kill the seedlings rapidly.

Do not over fertilize. At most once a month a little miracle grow.

Too much fertilizer kills daylilies, too little is not a problem.





Hybridizing Daylilies in Ontario

CAUTION: if you bring in some daylilies from outside, they ALWAYS have aphids.

Be sure that you have killed all of the aphids before you pot the seeds.





Aphid attack after a few days indoors.



Permethrin residual sprays kill aphids.


Most other pesticides are contact only and you usually miss a lot in the base of the leaves.

Wilson 1 Shot is available at Canadian Tire. Ben's is available in the US.

Spray OUTSIDE, then next day bring in the daylily.


